Summary

This course provides an introduction into the topics of improvisation, invention and creativity in music and covers core theories and practical exercises.

Content

The art of improvisation lies at the root of many musical traditions around the world from ancient origins up to musical cultures of the present day, such as in Indian music or Jazz. The purpose of this class is to introduce core techniques, and reflect concepts and problems around the notions of musical improvisation, invention and creativity. The course will combine practical and theoretical parts.

In the theoretical part, positions from musicological, philosophical, cross-cultural, cognitive and computational sciences will be covered. Students will learn to discuss and critically reflect core approaches to the topic and to integrate different or opposing viewpoints. Furthermore, relations between creativity and discovery in arts and science will be discussed. In the practical part, students will learn and try different techniques of musical improvisation, spontaneity and performance in different individual and joint interaction exercises.

A practical musical background will be beneficial for the practical parts of this class (if you are unsure, contact the teacher).

Teaching methods

The class will combine introductory lectures on the key topics in musical improvisation and creativity literature with interactive reflection and discussion. The class will contain different practical and theoretical exercises. Students will try different methods of improvisation in small groups, read the literature requirements and do short presentations and discussions of key texts in the field, and analyze musical examples and improvisations.

Expected student activities

- 1. Completing readings and assigned presentations, active participation and discussion in the class
- 2. Engage in practical parts, improvisation exercises and critical musical analysis
- 3. Final essay / class work with an optional practical component

Assessment methods

- 1. Presentation and discussion of a specific topic
- 2. Final essay / class work with an optional practical component
