Résumé

Cet enseignement aborde des problématiques actuelles en privilégiant des éclairages d'ordre historique, économique, technologique ou géopolitique. Il permet aux étudiants de développer une réflexion critique sur le processus de mondialisation en intégrant la question de l'autre et de l'ailleurs.

Contenu

The course focuses on contemporary issues from both a global and a local perspective. The circulation of people, goods and ideas is used to highlight spatial and temporal dynamics.

During the **autumn semester** students are introduced to specific themes (e.g., inequality and development, global production networks, global climate negotiations). Each theme is addressed through a lecture and critical reading of texts. 2 sessions are devoted to anthropology and one session is devoted to preparing the project in the spring semester. A keynote speaker is invited to discuss a timely topic related to globalization.

The session breakdown is as follows:

1. Introduction to the course
2. Introduction to critical reading and anthropology
3. Anthropology of globalization
4. Economic history I (lecture + seminar)
5. Economic history II (lecture + seminar)
6. Economic history III (lecture + seminar)
7. Political economy I (lecture + seminar)
8. Political economy II (lecture + seminar)
9. Political economy III (lecture + seminar)
10. Keynote speaker (date to be confirmed)
11. Geopolitics I (lecture + seminar)
12. Geopolitics II (lecture + seminar)
13. Geopolitics III (lecture + seminar)
14. Project methodology

During the **spring semester** students work in groups either on topics specific to climate change in Russia or technology/manufacturing in China. Lecturers provide guidance on semester projects.

Méthode d'enseignement

Autumn semester: *ex cathedra* lectures, oral presentations and discussions, guest lecture(s)

Spring semester: Group work under lecturer supervision

Travail attendu

Students are expected to participate actively during the autumn semester (questions, comments), to discuss orally a reading (in groups of 3) and to critique another text. At the end of the semester students have to produce an analysis of a text integrating the global and local perspectives of the circulation of people, goods and ideas.

During the spring semester students work in groups to produce a written report on a topic agreed upon with the lecturers.

Méthode d'évaluation

Autumn semester:

- Oral presentation of a text (groupwork): 40%
- Oral critique of a text (groupwork): 20%
- Individual analysis of a text (1'500 words): 40%

Spring semester:

- Intermediary oral presentation of the report (groupwork): 20%
- Final report (groupwork): 80%

Assignments can be written in English or French.
