Summary

The course will tackle different types of practicing architecture with a focus on communication tools and its different formats to convey an architectural message. It explores strategies for translating the built environment with an experimental approach and a practical outcome.

Content

Today the practice of architecture cannot be reduced to the act of physical building. Architectureâ##s social and cultural dimension depends on different types of practice - from writing to filming, from publications to exhibitions. Each type as its own particularities but both depend on multiple ways of translating and communicating about the built environment. To be aware of these different types of practice and to discover some of today's actors will empower students and help them as agents-in-becoming (Mieke Bal), capable of actively participating in the contemporary ##baukultur.

The course will be organized around three cores: a Research Project (pratical work) will be developed by the students where a specific medium will be used to investigate an architectural artefact (still image, moving image/documentary, sound/podcast, text/publication), News from the Front will present and invite different actors that explore different architectural practices, and Tools and Mediums will be a 'salon' for literature based discussions around the central topic of the unit.
