This course will develop the student's critical thinking, problem-solving and presentation skills to assess and understand the problematics linked to ESG investing and reporting.

By the end of the course, the student must be able to:

- Recognize the complexity of ESG and ESG Disclosures
- Examine the trade-offs between creating profits and enhancing ESG
- Distinguish "Greenwashing" and true ESG
- Explore recent developments in sustainability accounting
- · Analyze and benchmark ESG and sustainability metrics in the corporate annual reports of companies
- · Develop critical thinking, analytical and presentation skills

## Transversal skills

- Give feedback (critique) in an appropriate fashion.
- Identify the different roles that are involved in well-functioning teams and assume different roles, including leadership roles.
- Respect relevant legal guidelines and ethical codes for the profession.
- Demonstrate the capacity for critical thinking
- Demonstrate a capacity for creativity.
- Continue to work through difficulties or initial failure to find optimal solutions.
- Make an oral presentation.
- Access and evaluate appropriate sources of information.

### **Assessment methods**

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The evaluation in this course will be based on group projects (65% of the grade), group presentations (20% of the grade) and an individual project (15% of the grade).
